Show Schedule and Entry Form

Regulations for Exhibitors

1. Adult exhibitors must reside, work or be a member of a club in **Stokeinteignhead, Combeinteignhead, Hacombe or Maidencombe** Parishes. Entries for the children's classes will also be accepted from children living outside the parish who have relatives living in the parish and from children who attend Stokeinteignhead School.
2. Entry Fee of 30p per exhibit, four entries for £1.00 for adults. Entries to Children's classes are free.
3. An entry form must be completed and handed in with fees by **no later than 5.00pm on Wednesday 20th August 2025 to:**

Entry forms can be obtained from the Shop or downloaded from the Stokeinteignhead Village website: www.stokeinteignhead-village.co.uk
4. One entry per exhibitor per class. Unrestricted entries for children.
5. Exhibits in all classes must be the work of the exhibitor.
6. Exhibitors in the flower and floral art sections must provide their own containers.
7. All preserve labels should state type and date made only - no other details.
8. No exhibit should show a name or any other form of identification.
9. The Committee will take every possible care of exhibits, but do not hold themselves responsible for any breakages or damage.
10. The Judge's decision will be final in all cases.
11. Entries to be staged on Saturday 23rd August 2025 between 8.30am and 11.30am.
Judging will take place at 12.00 noon. **No-one allowed in the hall at this time except named Judges, Stewards and members of the Committee.**
Doors open to the general public at 2.30pm.
Awards will be presented at 4.15pm.
Exhibits to be cleared by 5.15pm.

Awards Schedule

Show trophies will be awarded to those exhibitors with the most points in Sections A, B, C, D, E and F (not including Heaviest, Largest, Longest) with separate trophies for the winner of the Children's Classes, Photography Class, Family Class and Arts and Crafts.

Points awarded in each class will be:

1st place = 4 points; 2nd place = 2 points; 3rd place = 1 point.

Children aged 16 years and under will be awarded one point for each children's class that they enter.

Section A - Flowers: *Own vases to be used*

1. Dahlias 3 blooms decorative variety or varieties
2. Dahlia 1 specimen bloom – no buds
3. Rose 1 vase of any 3 blooms - large flower
4. Rose 1 specimen bloom – no buds
5. Rose Cluster flower 1 vase 3 stems (1 or more varieties)
6. Hydrangeas 1 head – Lace Cap
7. Hydrangeas 1 head – Mop Head
8. House plant In a pot not exceeding 20cm (8inches) diameter
9. Fuchsias 4 Heads on a board with stems in water (Double Flower)
10. Fuchsias 4 Heads on a board with stems in water (Single Flower)
11. Rudbeckia 3 stems – any variety
12. Sunflower 1 specimen – no buds
13. Delphinium 1 specimen
14. Sweet Peas 5 stems – any variety
15. Cactus *or* Succulent In a pot not exceeding 20cm (8 inches) diameter
16. Snap Dragon 3 stems
17. A Vase containing 3 of any one type of flower not from the list above
18. Begonia 1 in a pot not exceeding 25cm (10 inches) diameter

Section B – Fruit and Vegetables

19. French Beans 6 pods - displayed directly on table
20. Runner Beans 6 pods - as above
21. Broad Beans 6 pods – as above
22. Peas 5 pods – displayed on a plate
23. Mange Tout 5 pods – displayed on a plate
24. Onions 5 - must all be the same size, all large or all small
25. Garlic 3 bulbs
26. Potatoes White, 5 any shape on a dish or plate
27. Potatoes Coloured, 5 any shape on a dish or plate
28. Beetroot 3 of any one variety
29. Courgettes 3 of any one variety (10 – 15cms in length)
30. Tomatoes 5 ordinary cultivars
31. Tomatoes 5 small fruited
32. Tomatoes 5 of any variety, size and colour
33. Carrots 3 of any one variety - displayed directly on table
34. Cucumber 2 – displayed directly on table
35. Lettuce 1 – root should be washed – displayed directly on table
36. Radish 5 – displayed on a plate, keep 1” of foliage on
37. Chard 5 - displayed in glass of water
38. Chillies 6 – mixed or one variety - displayed on a plate

Entries in this section will **not** contribute to the overall points score; however, a prize will be awarded for the best exhibit in each category.

51. Heaviest Potato
52. Heaviest Onion

56. Funniest looking fruit or vegetable

Section C – Floral Art

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material contained within a specified space.

57. A vase from my garden – no accessories allowed
58. A display entirely within the vase – accessories allowed
59. Tiny Treasures: 10cm x 10cm x 10cm – accessories allowed
60. Flash of Gold – no accessories allowed
61. It's In the Bag: 50cm x 50cm max – accessories allowed

Section D – Homemade Bakes

62. Victoria Sandwich Using the creamed method (6oz of all dry ingredients: SR flour, unsalted butter, caster sugar and 3 eggs, with raspberry jam filling)
63. Technical Challenge 3 Chocolate Eclairs, same size, with fresh cream filling
64. Gluten Free 'Savoury'
65. Bread 1 loaf – any shape – displayed on a board no larger than A4 size
66. Vegetable Cake Must contain at least one vegetable – state veg
67. Vegan Cake Any flavour
68. Scones 3 fruit scones - displayed on a small plate
69. Cheese Scones 3 – displayed on a small plate
70. Biscuits 3 of same variety
71. Dried Fruit Cake No alcoholic ingredients
72. Eggs 6 Hen eggs displayed in a box
73. Eggs 6 Duck eggs displayed on a plate or basket

Section E – Homemade Preserves and Pickles

74. Jam Own choice – made from fresh fruit
At least 12oz jar - not exceeding 1lb
75. Marmalade Own choice – made from fresh fruit
At least 12oz jar – not exceeding 1lb
76. Lemon Curd Made from fresh fruit
At least 12oz jar – not exceeding 1lb
77. Jar of Jelly Any size. Can be savoury or sweet, with a label stating which flavour
78. Chutney Own choice. At least 12oz jar – not exceeding 1lb
79. Jar of Local Honey 1lb jar and any variety

Section F – Homemade Drinks

80. Fruit flavoured gin
81. Vodka – any flavour
82. Homemade Liqueur
83. Any other alcoholic drink not listed above. A label should state the contents
84. Fruit or Flower Cordial
85. Non-alcoholic Drink

Section G – Children’s under 7 years

Section I – Children’s 12 – 16 years

86. Recycle a plastic milk bottle
87. Make and decorate a paper windmill
88. A painting using hands and feet

90. Make and decorate a gingerbread biscuit - any shape and design
91. Open class: the favourite thing you’ve made in the last 12 months

Section J - Photography

Each photograph (colour or black and white) must be un-mounted, no larger than A5 (148mm x 210mm) size and no elements from a second photograph to be incorporated. It will be displayed on a large screen held in place by pins.

Section L – Arts and Crafts: All items must have been made within the previous 12 months.

101. A working toy made from any media, and which can be played with
102. A mosaic picture – own choice of materials
103. Item made of yarn or string.
104. Open class: the favourite thing you’ve made in the last 12 months

Please remember to make a separate note of the entries you are exhibiting for your own records.

Hints and Tips on presenting your exhibits

This is not an exhaustive list, but a few tips which may help when presenting your exhibits. It is difficult to always present entries that are perfect, but don't be put off as we are all "in the same boat".

French/Runner Beans: Fresh pods, straight and same length – leaving a portion of the stalk on each.

Onions/Garlic: Uniform well ripened bulbs; avoid over skinning; wash roots and trim, leaving some on. Leave 7cms of stalk and bend over and tie or whip.

Potatoes: Same size – free from skin blemishes – wash gently.

Courgettes: Young tender shapely and uniform. Can be displayed with or without flowers on.

Rhubarb: Straight sticks with 3" of leaf.

Tomatoes: Aim for uniform firm set of fruit with small eyes and firm fresh calyces (the small leaf like bit where the stalk joins the fruit).

Carrots: Straight, of uniform size, washed carefully – leaving on approx. 6–7cms of stalk.

Beetroot: Pick roots of even size, 6 – 8cms across, leaving on the tap root and approx. 7cms of stalk.

Fruit: Always leave stalks on.

Dahlias, Roses & Sunflowers: If one specimen bloom is required do not leave any buds on the stem, as these are also counted as blooms.

*Jam, Marmalade & Jelly

Jars should be clean and well filled to about 3mm from the top.

Covers: wax circle with cellophane outer cover or twist top, which should be plain.

Colour should be even, bright and characteristic of fruit used – no scum, mould, sugar crystals or foreign bodies.

Fruit should be evenly distributed and tender.

Consistency should be jellified, not runny or sticky.

Flavour should be full, fresh and characteristic of the fruit used.

*Pickles & Chutney

Jars should be clean and filled to about ½ inch (12mm) from the top and labelled with contents and date of making.

Tops of jars must be vinegar resistant.

***No name or personal details should be shown on jars and lids.**

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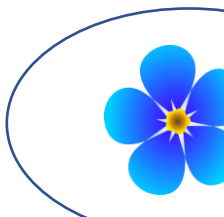
